

**ANNUAL REPORT OF THE EXAMINATION CELL
NORTH LAKHIMPUR COLLEGE (AUTONOMOUS)**

2013-2014

Prelude:

North Lakhimpur College was granted autonomous status from the academic level from the session 2013-14 vide UGC letter no. F. 22-1/2013 (AC) dated 22nd May, 2013 New Delhi. The Examination Cell, North Lakhimpur College (Autonomous) was established in May, 2013 as per the UGC regulations of Autonomous College. Under the autonomy system the college has set up an 'Examination Cell', as per regulation provided in the guidelines of Autonomous Colleges prepared by UGC. The Principal of the college is the Chief Controller of Examinations. The Examination Cell is headed by the Controller of Examinations with two Deputy Controller of Examinations to assist him. All other examination related matters are governed by the Examination Ordinance, 2013 of North Lakhimpur College (Autonomous).

Examination Pattern:

The College follows CBSS (choice based semester system) for UG and PG programmes. Usually two exams are conducted per year after the end of each semester at both UG and PG levels. The UG and PG examination is conducted in the following way as per the regulations of examination manual. Course wise/programme wise time table is published and announced well in advance. For each examination one external Senior Supervisors is nominated. The Principal or his nominee acts as Internal Senior Supervisor and also Custodian of Question papers. Immediately after the examination, written answer books of students are sent to university in sealed cover to office of the controller for coding and central valuation. A student must complete minimum 120 credits to complete his/her B.Sc. / B.A. /B.C.A. programme and 40 credits for P.G.D.C.A. programme. A candidate shall be declared as passed a course, provided he/ she secures at least 40% marks in the course in the End-Semester Examination and at least 40% marks in the aggregate in the 'In' and 'End' Semester Examination.

Automation Status

The examination system is automated. The marks cards, ledgers, issue of hall tickets, allocation of register numbers, marks card, issuance of passing certificates etc. have been computerized. and a centrally monitored data base system has been created. The marks per paper of student are entered to computers by two operators separately to ensure correct feeding. Further examination software generates the results. This has facilitated flexibility and rapidity of action in each sphere of activity in the examination branch. The whole examination cell is under CC TV surveillance. The final results of the students at various examinations are communicated to the stakeholders through the publication of the results on the Internet or University Website. There is a provision to download the results from the Internet directly. The issuance of provisional Degree/Diploma certificates is also computerized to ensure elegance and avoidance of delay.
