A basketball court is being constructed with the financial assistance from Ministry of Sports and Youth Welfare, GOI. The Career Counselling Cell has been redesigned. Immensely concerned about the welfare as well as the intellectual and ethical development of the students, the institution provides value education, coaching and remedial classes besides establishing forums for community development and extension activities, establishing Equal Opportunity Centre, Women Study Centre, Day Care Centre etc during 2009-10.

## Criterion wise inputs for the year 2009-2010

#### 1. Activities reflecting the goals and objectives of the institution:

The College is committed to raising standards of higher education in this part of North Eastern India and for us, offering high quality teaching is more than just a priority- it is our raison d'etre. The University Grants Commission has also conferred the status of College with Potential for Excellence (CPE) to this College in 2010. At present the College offers graduate level courses in Arts and Science in twenty (20) subjects besides the selffinanced B.C.A course. Based on the need, new courses at UG level have been introduced. Certificate and short term modular programmes are offered as value addition. Thrust has been given to relevant knowledge, skills, value addition and value based education leading to overall personality. There is very little scope for an affiliating college to develop new programmes as the academic authority rests in the hand of the affiliating University. Despite this, North Lakhimpur College undertakes environmental survey for the need of new courses, subjects, combinations based on current trends, market and societal needs and student's expectations. Introduction of new inter-disciplinary academic programmes namely P.G. Diploma in Disaster Management (under UGC's Innovative Scheme) and Post B.Sc. Diploma in Plant Tissue Culture and Micro propagation (DBT's Biotechnology popularization Scheme) are the results of such efforts. It provides Certificate and Diploma course in Herbal (Medicinal) Plantation, Information Technology, Repair and Maintenance of Consumer Electric Equipments, Human Rights and Gandhian Studies, Post Graduate Diploma in Plant Tissue Culture and Micro propagation, Disaster Management. The College has also started Major in Electronics from the session 2008-09. To ensure that the College maintains high standards of education in a student friendly manner, the authority takes feedback at regular intervals from the students and utilizes the data constructively. The practice of taking feedback from academic peers and employer has also been initiated. To further the usages of information technology among students, the College has established two state of the art Computer and Networking Centre with 40 internet browsing

terminals, installed VPN for education in addition to the existing EDUSAT besides encouraging the use of ICT tools in the teaching learning process. The College is also promoting the concept of improving the qualification of faculty members as the number of Ph.D., and M.Phil degree holders has improved in comparison to the level at the first assessment and accreditation. Moreover, the following best practices in various activities can be mentioned:

- Introduction of career oriented ICT enabled courses like courses like Information Technology.
- Establishment of state of the art Computer Networking Center in 2009.
- Providing special coaching and teaching of students to prepare them to sit for highly competitive examinations as per the UGC guidelines.
- Establishment of Women Study Centre to take a broader view of the women's studies constituency by supporting women to pursue study in this region and facilitating them to network with constituents involved in similar work.
- Establishment of "Equal Opportunity Centre" to provide a solid grounding in interdisciplinary studies by emphasizing various aspects of social and cultural life in relation to other social divisions and inequalities.
- Remedial classes to slow learners and challenges to advanced learners.
- Involvement of academic experts, experts from industries and central Universities in Post B.Sc. diploma course.

## 01. New academic programmes initiated:

As the curriculum is provided by the university, there is no provision for the college to modify the syllabus, as such no mid-course correction is possible. The curriculum is decided by the university. However, the college aims at equipping the students with the diverse knowledge and exposure to meet the global challenges, so that they can develop confidence to face the real life. The college believes that by providing hand on training in ICT, it can assist the students in developing an awareness of cutting edge careers. The College has recently started a certificate course in "Information Technology" under the UGC's scheme of COP. The students pursuing the BCA course in the College have been provided with both basics and advanced skills in computer usage and applications. In addition to the existing EDUSAT, installation of VPN for education, usage of ICT tools in teaching, learning and evaluation works in the college is a positive step in helping the students community to compete in the global employment markets

Short term courses on Computer Science have been conducted to impart basic ICT enabled skills among all the students. New Certificate course in Gandhian Thought has been introduced in 2010 as enrichment course.

#### 02. <u>Innovation in curricular design and Transaction</u>:

As the college is affiliated to Dibrugarh University, the frequency and the basis for syllabus revision is carried out by the Board of Studies of the said university. The last major revision made by the university introduced Internal Assessment in the final evaluation of a student. However, most of the senior faculty of the College are members of Board of Studies of the affiliating University. The College has started Major in Electronics and pass course in Home Science.

#### 03. <u>Interdisciplinary programmes started:</u>

- The College has recently started a certificate course in "Information Technology" under the UGC's scheme of COP.
- New Certificate course in Gandhian Thought has been introduced in 2010 as enrichment course.
- Short term courses on Computer Science have been conducted to impart basic ICT enabled skills among all the stakeholders.

## 05. Examination reforms implemented:

The college follows the instructions formulated by Dibrugarh University at degree level. However, the institution arranges monthly Unit Test and one Terminal Test during specific time schedule to update the academic skills of the students. Further, every department of the college organizes seminar involving students of the major classes twice in a month. Intimation to parents-guardians about the marks secured by students in University examinations, unit/sessional tests and attendance of students is also made.

## 06. <u>Candidates qualified for NET/SLET/GATE etc.</u>

As an under graduate college, no regular students can appear in the NET/SLET examination. However, a good number of pass out students have cleared such examinations. One teacher namely Mintu Neog of Political Science Department of this College has cleared SLET examination in 2010.

## 07. <u>Initiative towards faculty development programme</u>:

The college has taken a few initiative measures for the faculty development with financial assistance from UGC and other sources & through self-finance.

- (i) Encourages faculty members to participate in Refresher Courses,
  Orientation Programmes.
- (ii) Recommends the teacher to apply for MRP.
- (iii) The College has the provision of giving study leave to interested teachers to pursue research works leading to Ph.D or M.Phil. by adjusting their teaching schedule without hampering the normal academic atmosphere of the college. Many faculty members are doing research towards their Ph.D or M.Phil degree in Rajiv Gandhi University, Arunachal Pradesh; Gauhati University, Assam; Tezpur Central University, Assam, and also under Distance Education System of various Universities
- (iv) Encourages attending Seminars, Workshops, and Conference etc.
- (v) Organizes Seminar, Workshop, Training Programme etc to provide linkage with persons of national & international reputation so as to update the faculty members with recent trends & information & developing their skills by way of interaction & exchange of views.
- (vi) Encourage faculty members to express their views & noble thoughts by publishing articles & other writings.
- (vii) Involves teachers for all round development of the college.

(4) On 27<sup>th</sup> December 2009, 23<sup>rd</sup> Golap Sarmah memorial North East Inter College/ Universities Debating Competition was organized by Debating and Symposium section of North Lakhimpur College Students Union at North Lakhimpur College auditorium.

## 11. New collaborative research programme:

Although the College has not yet signed any MOU with other institutions for collaborative research works, the teachers of various departments have been able to build linkages with reputed institutions through their research activities. As part of CPE Scheme, the College has started to constitute a "Disaster Management Cell" in collaboration with GOs, NGOs to build a corpus of trained people who can render valuable services in the time of crisis to minimize the affect of natural calamities. The Cell will also try to develop a database-driven information system for Disaster Management Authorities (DMA), NGOs and other organisations. We will also appeal to NGOs, relief workers, DMAs and individuals to share their experiences and volunteer services and resources to develop the proposed database. The College also encourages its faculty to undertake research projects in thrust areas not only at the regional level but also at the national level although the College is not a research institute. As such some teachers are engaged in doing research in some multidisciplinary areas of present interest. Within the limited scope available for research activities inside the College, some of the faculty members are able to contribute to the subject knowledge and community developments through their research findings published in various research journals of international and national repute.

Department of Science and Technology has sanctioned Rs. 50 lakh for infrastructure development of science faculty under FIST programme. The 2<sup>nd</sup> phase of this grant was released in 2009-10. Further

department of Bio-technology has sanctioned nearly rupees half crore for introducing diploma course in Plant Tissue Culture and Micro-propagation. Rs. 5,04,015.00 has been sanctioned by Govt. N.S.D.F for constructing a basket ball court. Rs. 10,000.00 was released by UNDP for holding a workshop.

#### 18. Community Service

The College encourages the faculty members and the students to devote time for Community Services so as to develop civic social responsibility and attachment to the local and external socio economic and socio cultural environment. The students of North Lakhimpur College are taught about their civic responsibilities through various extension programmes of NSS and NCC. The college gives priority to promote social responsibilities and citizenship amongst the students through co-curricular and extracurricular programmes. The college also arranges special talks by experts to promote value education, social service, and community orientation. The initial focus of activities of the newly established "Equal Opportunity Centre" at North Lakhimpur College is to provide a solid grounding in interdisciplinary studies by emphasizing various aspects of social and cultural life in relation to other social divisions and inequalities like poverty, illiteracy, lack of independence, oppressive social customs and gender bias among the SC/ST/minorities & women students. The centre is believed to play a vital role in academic progress through its short term course which will be commenced at the beginning of the session to help the SC/ST/minorities and women student of the college to build leadership, communication, decision making and problem solving skills.

The college involves all its stake holders in various community development programmes like health and hygiene, environmental issues, usage of rural technology, literacy, dignity of labour and social service. Such extension activities have significant impact on the community and will help in improving the lifestyle of the community, particularly in rural areas. Community participation in programmes like celebration of Independence Day, Republic Day, National AIDS Day, College Foundation Day, Gandhi Jayanti, Sankardeva tithe, Swaraswati Puja and so on are also highly encouraged.

The various activities performed by the NCC wing of the College during 2009-10 are:

- a) Combined Annual Training Camp held from 19<sup>th</sup> to 28<sup>th</sup> November,2009 at Tezpur in which 22 cadets participated. One Cadet got Alpha Grading among all the participating cadets.
- b) National Integration Camp held in Ranchi in September, 2009.
- c) National Integration Camp held in Kohima in July, 2009.

The various activities performed by the NSS wing of the College during 2009-10 are:

- 1) Social service Programme: Total 100 volunteers of N.S.S wing North Lakhimpur College had complete a cleanliness inside and outside the college campus. The college authority provided the required financial assistance for the programme.

- V) Tranning Programme on Social Harmony and National Unity: Mr. Dimbeswar Das has participated as a programme officer in the training programme on Social Harmony and National Unity, held Guwahati from 16<sup>th</sup> to 21<sup>st</sup> March, 2009.
