North Lakhimpur College (Autonomous), established in 1952, has successfully carved its niche in the arena of higher education in Assam. Committed to raising standards of higher education, the college intends to equip the learners with sound theoretical knowledge, adequate practical exposure and develop in them the capacity to think critically and progressively. Probably it is the recognition of such efforts that the college was awarded the prestigious 'A' grade by the National Assessment and Accreditation Council (NAAC). The founders aspired to enhance socio-cultural development of various ethnic groups, create scientific temperament, enhance employability of students and promote gender equality. Immensely concerned about the welfare as well as the intellectual and ethical development of the students, the institution provides value education, coaching and remedial classes besides establishing forums for community development and extension activities, establishing Equal Opportunity Centre, Women's Studies Centre etc. The college is committed to raising standards of higher education in this part of North Eastern India and for us, offering high quality teaching is more than just a priority- it is our raison d'être. The University Grants Commission was also conferred the status of College with Potential for Excellence (CPE) to the college in 2010 for a period of 5 years, further extended up to 2019. We are also the first autonomous college of the state. At present the College offers graduate level courses in Arts and Science in twenty (20) subjects besides the self-financed P.G.D.D.M, B.P.E.S and P.G.D.C.A., programmes. Based on the need, new courses at UG level have been introduced. The college has been successfully running PG programmes in Assamese, Electronics & Communication Technology, Political Science, Chemistry, Education, English, Botany, Physics, Zoology, Economics and Mass Communication. The college offers research degree (Ph.D. and M. Phil.) in Assamese, Political Science, Botany, English and Education. Besides these, departments of the college introduced various Add-on courses. The college has also started two courses on Sericulture, Office Automation, e-governance under UGC Community College Scheme from this



session and B.Voc. courses in traditional apparel designing and marketing and mobile technology and cloud computing. Certificate and short-term modular programmes are offered as value addition. Thrust has been given to relevant knowledge, skills, value addition and value Contents based education leading to overall personality. North Lakhimpur College undertakes surveys occasionally for the need of new courses, subjects, combinations based on current trends, market and societal needs and student's expectations. Introduction of new inter-disciplinary academic programmes namely P.G. Diploma in Disaster Management (under UGC's Innovative Scheme) is the result of such efforts. It provide Certificate and Diploma course in Human Rights and Gandhian Studies, Disaster Management. Certificate courses in Tourism & Travel and Analytical & Computational Chemistry, Assamese Language in Computer, Women Study etc. Another event to cheer is the newly constructed Biotech Hub (Sponsored by Department of Biotechnology, Ministry of Science & Technology, Government of India) which promises to enhance research and provide training in Biotechnology. To ensure that the College maintains high standards of education in a student friendly manner, the authority takes feedback at regular intervals from the students and utilizes the data constructively. Recently the college has gain position in 150-200 rank band of NIRF institution ranking. North Lakhimpur College has proved to have the strategy to percolate the positive outcome of the innovations in teaching with an interdisciplinary approach. The gradual reform has made the college holistically efficient and credible both at the academic and administrative level. The learning is made student-centered by participatory learning activities through laboratory work; computer aided learning programmes, audio visual aids, project and field works, training programmes and study tours. To further the usages of information technology among students, the college has established two state of art Computer and Networking Centres with 50 internet-browsing terminals besides encouraging the use of ICT tools in the teaching learning process. The campus has wifi connectivity. A state of the art language laboratory is also there. The thrust area identified in consonance with the CPE guidelines is to affect a paradigm shift in the knowledge delivery system. We visualize, in the immediate future, a smooth transition to digital learning without sacrificing the strengths of the conventional classroom. The college has a main campus with a total area of 25 acres of land with compound wall all around and good infrastructure facilities for academic, administrative and co curricular activities which include, adequate number of class rooms, well-equipped laboratories, library and reading room, administrative block, botanical garden, playground, gymnasium hall, canteen and parking facilities. The Arts Building is being extended to meet the demands of the students. The

college library and computer facilities are easily accessible to students and faculty members. The college library has adequate space with reading room facility for students and faculty, issue counter, stack room and bound volume room. Facilities like touch screen computer, visual book display presenter, photocopier, scanner etc are available in the library. A retail outlet, selling student related materials and books is also functional. The college has a 4-hundred-meter synthetic track, a well-equipped gymnasium hall, and a basketball court funded by the Ministry of Sports and Youth Affairs, Govt. of India. The college has 400 mt. Synthetic track funded by MOSYA. The college strongly believes that its primary stake holders are students. It also understands the geographic, sociodemographic, economic and educational background of the people of this region. The college intends to provide quality education to all keeping in view the intelligence and economic status of the students. Whereas special remedial classes are organized for the academically poor students, the economically vulnerable but meritorious students are provided free admission and other in-house scholarships. North Lakhimpur College strictly adheres to the basic directives of U.G.C. for providing equal educational opportunities to differently abled persons. To boost the morale of the students, the institution itself offers various scholarships and awards to recognize meritorious achievements of the students in different fields apart from the scholarships received by the students from central and state government as per the government rules. The college also maintains a 'Student Aid Fund'. A Career and Counseling Cell has been established for offering free career counseling to students and also for guiding the young minds to understand their strength by providing them with requisite know how of the emerging trends in different fields. The authority is leaving no stone unturned to guarantee that the College improvise the existing infrastructure so that it can keep pace with the global trends whether it be in the field of research work or to enhance the quality of the teaching-learning process. Congenial academic atmosphere in a pollution free campus, introduction of innovative, self financing and industrial courses, ICT enabled teaching-learning practices, adequate infrastructure, library and other resources, good hostel facilities for both boys' and girls', good teachers' quality, transparent admission and enforcement of reservations, good results and progression are some of the key factors that attract students and stakeholders to North Lakhimpur College. # Four Year Under-Graduate Programme (FYUP)

(in line with NEP 2020)

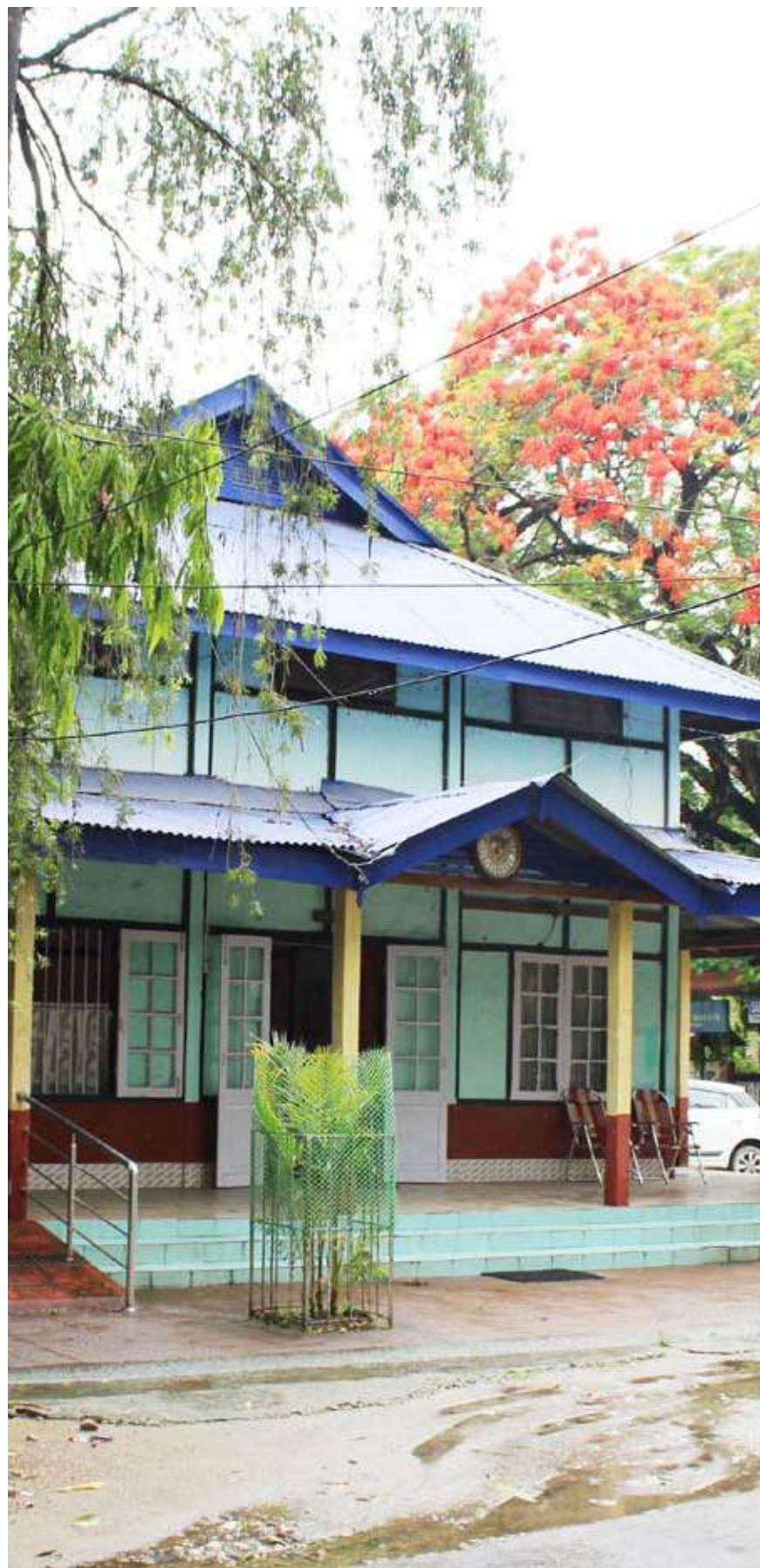
## Course Structure:

### 3.1 Major and Minor disciplines

- Major discipline is the discipline or subject of main focus and the degree will be awarded in that discipline. Students should secure the prescribed number of credits (about 50% of total credits) through core courses in the major discipline.
- Minor discipline helps a student to gain a broader understanding beyond the major discipline. For example, if a student pursuing an Economics major obtains a minimum of 12 credits from a bunch of courses in Statistics, then the student will be awarded B.A. degree in Economics with a Minor in Statistics.

### 3.2 Awarding UG Certificate, UG Diploma, and Degrees

- UG Certificate: Students who opt to exit after completion of the first year and have secured 40 credits will be awarded a UG certificate if, in addition, they complete one vocational course of 4 credits during the summer vacation of the first year. These students are allowed to re-enter the degree programme within three years and complete the degree programme within the stipulated maximum period of seven years.
- UG Diploma: Students who opt to exit after completion of the second year and have secured 80 credits will be awarded the UG diploma if, in addition, they complete one vocational course of 4 credits during the summer vacation of the second year. These students are allowed to re-enter within a period of three years and complete the degree programme within the maximum period of seven years.



- 3-year UG Degree: Students who wish to undergo a 3-year UG programme will be awarded UG Degree in the Major discipline after successful completion of three years, securing 120 credits and satisfying the minimum credit requirement as given in table 2 (Section 5).
- 4-year UG Degree (Honours): A four-year UG Honours degree in the major discipline will be awarded to those who complete a four-year degree programme with 160 credits and have satisfied the credit requirements as given in table 2 in Section 5.
- 4-year UG Degree (Honours with Research): Students who secure 75% marks and above in the first six semesters and wish to undertake research at the undergraduate level can choose a research stream in the fourth year. They should do a research project or dissertation under the guidance of a faculty member of the University/College. The research project/dissertation will be in the major discipline. The students who secure 160 credits, including 12 credits from a research project/dissertation, are awarded UG Degree (Honours with Research).
- UG Degree Programmes with Single Major: A student has to secure a minimum of 50% credits from the major discipline for the 3-year/4-year UG degree to be awarded a single major. For example, in a 3-year UG programme, if the total number of credits to be earned is 120, a student of Physics with a minimum of 60 credits will be awarded a B.Sc. in Physics with a single major. Similarly, in a 4-year UG programme, if the total number of credits to be earned is 160, a student of Physics with a minimum of 80 credits will be awarded a B.Sc. (Hons./Hon. With Research) in Physics in a 4-year UG programme with single major.
- UG Degree Programmes with Double Major: A student has to secure a minimum of 40% credits from the second major discipline for the 3-year/4-year UG degree to be awarded a double major. For example, in a 3-year UG programme, if the total number of credits to be earned is 120, a student of Physics with a minimum of 48 credits will be awarded a B.Sc. in Physics with a double major. Similarly, in a 4-year UG programme, if the total number of credits to be earned is 160, a student of Physics with a minimum of 64 credits will be awarded a B.Sc. (Hons./Hon. With Research) in Physics in a 4-year UG programme with double major.
- Interdisciplinary UG Programmes: The credits for core courses shall be distributed among the constituent disciplines/subjects so as to get core competence in the interdisciplinary programme. For example, a degree in Econometrics requires courses in economics, statistics, and mathematics. The total credits to core courses shall be distributed so that the student gets full competence in Econometrics upon completion of the programme. The degree for such students will be awarded as B.Sc. in Econometrics for a 3-year UG programme or B.Sc. (Honours) / B.Sc. (Honours with Research) in Econometrics for a 4-year UG programme.
- Multidisciplinary UG Programmes: In the case of students pursuing a multidisciplinary programme of study, the credits to core courses will be distributed among the broad disciplines such as Life sciences, Physical Sciences, Mathematical and Computer Sciences, Data Analysis, Social Sciences, Humanities, etc., For example, a student who opts for a UG program in Life sciences will have the total credits to core courses distributed across Botany, Zoology and Human biology disciplines. The degree will be awarded as B.Sc. in Life Sciences for a 3-year programme and B.Sc. (Honours) in Life Sciences or B.Sc. (Honours with Research) for a 4-year programme without or with a research component respectively.

The statutory bodies of the College such as the Board of Studies and Academic Council will decide on the list of courses under major category and credit distribution for double major, interdisciplinary and multidisciplinary programmes.

- All candidates must appear in an Entrance Examination.
- The total marks of the Entrance Examination is 50, Time 2 hours.
- Admit Card & Roll No: All candidates are requested to bring a printout of their application form [Bar-coded]; this will be considered as admit card for the examination. The form no will be used as the roll no of the entrance examination.
- For preparation of the merit list, 50% marks will be taken from the Degree [BA/BSc/BCom] examination and 50% marks from entrance examination.
- For those students whose degree final examination results are yet to be declared, mark- sheets up to the 4th/5th Semester will be considered at the time of the entrance examination.
- Selected students must submit their final year Mark sheets, Certificates and other relevant documents after the declaration of their UG result, or else the seat will be cancelled.
- Admission will automatically be cancelled who fail in the Final Year Degree Examination.

### Integrated M.A.:

Assamese, English, Education, Economics, Political Science.

### Integrated M.Sc.:

Botany, Chemistry, Electronics, Physics, Zoology.

### Admission Procedure:

Admission for the integrated M.A./M.Sc. programme will be done through an entrance test conducted by the college. The syllabus for that exam will be the syllabus of the higher secondary course of the particular subject. The details about this exam will be notified later. Interested candidates are advised to check the college website regularly for future updates.

### Integrated M.A./M.Sc. Course Structure:

The integrated M.A./M.Sc. programme will be a 5 years (10 semester) course. The course structure for the first three years of the integrated M.A./M.Sc. programme will be the same as that of the first three years of the four years undergraduate programme (FYUP). The last two years of the integrated M.A./M.Sc. programme will be the same as that of the 2 year Post Graduate programme.

BCA Programme was started in North Lakhimpur College

in July 2006. There are six semesters covering three calendar years. Each Semester covers 20 credits, and six semesters carry 120 credits.

**Eligibility for admission:** 10+2 level Examination passed with Mathematics securing at least 45% marks (40% for SC/ST/OBC)

**Intake Capacity: 30**

Admission to the programme shall be based on an entrance test. The date of the examination shall be notified later.

**Syllabus for Entrance Test:** HS 2nd Year Mathematics syllabus of AHSEC & Logical Reasoning.

# Integrated BA B.Ed. and BSc. B.Ed. Programmes

North Lakhimpur College (Autonomous) is the first and only institution so far in the North Bank of Assam to get the recognition to run 'Integrated BA B. Ed' and 'Integrated BSc B.Ed' programmes under the newly launched 4 Year Integrated Teacher Education Programme (ITEP) by NCTE, New Delhi. The Integrated B.A. B. Ed. programme commenced in the academic session 2023-24 with an intake capacity of 50 students. The Integrated B.Sc. B. Ed programme will commence from the academic session 2024-25 with an intake capacity of 50 students.

National Council for Teacher Education (NCTE) has launched Integrated Teacher Education Programme (ITEP) in IITS. NITS Central State Government Universities and Government Colleges from the academic session 2023-24 throughout the country. This is a flagship programme of NCTE under NEP 2020. ITEP, as notified on 26 October 2021, is a 4 Year dual-major holistic undergraduate degree offering B.A. B.Ed./ B.Sc. B.Ed./ B.Com. B.Ed. This course will prepare teachers for the

4 stages of the new school structure i.e. Foundational, Preparatory, Middle and Secondary (5+3+3+4). ITEP will be available for all students who choose teaching as a profession after Secondary (+2). This integrated course will benefit students since they will save one year by finishing the course in 4 years rather than the customary 5 years required in the present B.A. + B.Ed. plan. Admission for this course will be carried out by the National Testing Agency (NTA) through a single nation-wide entrance test called the National Common Entrance Test (NCET).

The institutions which have been granted recognition for piloting ITEP programme from the academic session 2023-24 are hereby informed the following:

- NCTE is preparing the curriculum/ syllabi for the ITEP course which will be shared tentatively by the end of May 2023.
- The mode of examination, to be carried out by NTA, shall be online/Computer Based Test (CBT). The advertisement for the same will be issued shortly.

# General Information & Guidelines

## Requirements and Procedure for Admission

College prospectus may be downloaded from the website. One should carefully read the prospectus before filling up the online form. Admission to the college and hostels is strictly on merit and subject to the approval of the principal.

1. The application process for admission into the first year of B.A. (FYUGP)/B.Sc.(FYUGP)/Integrated M.A./M.Sc. (ITPG)/Integrated B.A. B.Ed./ Integrated B.Sc. B.Ed. (ITEP)/ B.A.C/ B.P.E.S/ B. Voc. (Travel and Tourism Management) for the session 2024-25 on North Lakhimpur College (Autonomous) has been started online through the e-Samarth portal of the Department of Education, Govt. of Assam. While filling up the application forms, applicants should note the following points.
2. Applicants who wish to apply for multiple programs have to submit separate form for each program. For example, if an applicant want to pursue B.A/ B.Sc or integrated M.A. or integrated B.A. B.Ed. with economics as the major subject than he/she has to submit separate forms for each program.
3. The departments in the college which offer Integrated M.A./M.Sc. (ITPG) courses are- Assamese, Botany, Chemistry, Economics, Education, Electronics, English, Physics, Political Science and Zoology. Admission for those courses will be done through an entrance test conducted by the college. The syllabus for that exam will be the syllabus of class XII of the particular subject. The details about this exam will be notified later.
4. For the courses B.A. (FYUGP)/B.Sc. (FYUGP) 20% seats will be filled up on the basis of the CUET score and the 80% seats will be filled up on the basis of the marks attained in class XII. The candidates appeared in CUET too have to apply through e-Samarth portal.
5. The applicants can choose only one subject as the major/honours in the application form. They can apply separately in the same portal for the second, third, fourth alternative major subjects.
6. Along with the Major and Minor courses, the students have to study Ability Enhancement course (AEC), MDC (Multidisciplinary Course), VAC9Value Added Course), SEC (Skill Enhancement Course). The details for selecting the subjects will be announced at the time of the publication of the merit list for admission.
7. The applicants seeking hostels have to apply through Google Form. The link for the google form: <https://bit.ly/nlchostel>
8. There is statutory reservation for SC, ST and OBC students as per Government of Assam regulations.
9. There is sport and music quota for admission into various classes (the exact number of seats is determined by the admission committee). For admission under the EC quota, applicants have to submit an application form along with essential evidences to the principal besides applying in the e- Samarth portal.

### N.B.

1. The dates of interview for admission to various classes are notified in advance. A list of eligible candidates for admission will be put up on the college website and notice board prior to the day of interview.
2. Students who are admitted on sports & music quota will have to show their performance as and when necessary, failing which their admission will be cancelled. Interview and admission will take place on the same day. The candidate will have to be present personally in the interview with the following documents and papers:
  - i) Original / Provisional pass certificate from the head of the institution last attended.
  - ii) Certificate of date of birth.
  - iii) Mark-sheets (original).
  - iv) Gap period certificate from appropriate persons, if required
  - v) Required amount of fees etc.
  - vi) Necessary documents as notified by the Govt. of Assam if Fee Waiver Scheme is availed.

The selected candidates must get themselves admitted on the very day of interview. Failure to turn up will forfeit the claim for admission.

## About free admission

### Who is eligible?

1. Students whose parental income is less than Rs. 1.00 Lakh from all sources will be eligible to avail this scheme.
2. If either of the parents (mother or father) of the student is working in the state Govt./Central Govt./ Semi Govt./ State or Central Govt. undertaking, such students will not be eligible for this scheme.

### Proof of Income/Documents required:

1. An Income Certificate from the Local Revenue Circle Officer/Mauzadar.
2. A declaration that neither of the parents (father or mother) of the student is an employee of State/Central Govt./Semi Govt./ State or Central Govt. undertaking. The declaration form will be provided by the College.

### Power of Admission Committee:

The Admission Committee of the college has the power to inquire about the income of the family in case of doubt and if the committee is of the view that

the income of the parents exceeds Rs. 2.00 Lakh, the committee may recommend cancellation.

### Duties and Responsibilities of Students availing the Scheme:

Students seeking admission in the 1st year of UG programme will plant a sapling at his/her College or at his/her home and shall submit a photograph of the same to the college. The Student has to nurse the sapling and have to submit a photograph of the same tree while seeking admission into 2nd year. A Scrutiny Committee shall be constituted comprising teachers from Biology background who shall examine the photographs and will assess the genuineness of the Photographs and growth of the plant. Only on receipt of recommendation from the Committee, the student can avail fee waiver for the 2nd year. This will be effective from the session 2018 (applicable to those who benefited under the scheme during the 2017 session). Students availing the 2nd year fee waiver during the Current Year will also plant a tree, nourish it and submit photographs of the same at present and subsequent admissions.

# Under Graduate and Post Graduate Examination & Evaluation procedure

- a) Examination and evaluation shall be done on a continuous and comprehensive basis during each semester.
- b) There shall be internal assessment in each course during every semester. The internal assessment marks are as below-
  - i) for FYUG Programme: 30 per cent of total marks.
  - ii) for CBCS Programme: 20 per cent of total marks.
  - iii) for PG Programme: 30 per cent of total marks.
- c) Re-evaluation can be avail as per NLC examination ordinance.
- d) Internal Assessment:
  - i. In internal assessment, different tools may be employed one or more assessment tools such as objective tests, written tests, assignments, paper presentation, laboratory work, etc. suitable to the courses.
  - ii. The students shall be informed in advance about the nature of assessment. Students shall compulsorily attend internal assessment, failing which they will not be allowed to appear for the End-semester examination. A student cannot repeat In semester examinations. The department may arrange special in semester examination whenever necessary.
- e) End Semester Examination:
  - i. There shall be one End semester examination in each course of a Semester covering the entire syllabus prescribed for the course.
  - ii. The Controller of Examinations shall make necessary arrangements for notifying the dates of the end semester examinations.
  - iii. Normally, the end –semester examination for each course shall be of three-hour duration.
- f) Setting of question papers, moderation of question papers, evaluation of answer scripts, scrutiny, tabulation of marks, etc. and announcement of results, shall be as per the **North Lakhimpur College (Autonomous) Examination Ordinance, 2013**.
- g) Practical Examination: Practical Examinations of a Semester shall normally be held prior to the End Semester Examinations.
- h) Betterment Examination:
  - i. A student shall be entitled to take the “betterment examinations” in any two theory courses of any of the six semesters after passing the sixth semester examination only once. In this case, the higher marks secured by the student shall be retained. The candidates shall have to apply for betterment examination within one year of passing the sixth semester examination.
  - ii. No betterment shall be allowed in the practical examinations.
  - iii. Any difficulty which may arise in the course of operation of these regulations relating to holding of examinations shall be removed by the Examination Committee of North Lakhimpur College (Autonomous).

**Note: A student admitted into the M.A/M.Sc. programmes shall have to clear at least 50% of the total course allotted in the first two semesters to be eligible for attending the 3rd Semester classes.**

# Results and progression of BA & BSc programme

- a) A candidate, shall be declared as passed a course, provided he/she secures -
  - (i) at least 40% marks in each course in the end semester examinations.
  - (ii) at least 40% marks in each course in aggregate in the in and end-semester examinations.
- b) A candidate shall be declared as passed a semester, provided he/ she passes all the courses of a semester independently.
- c) The marks of in-semester examinations (30 per cent of total for FYUG Programme and 20 per cent for CBCS Programme) obtained by the candidate shall be accounted in his/her total marks.
- d) A candidate who fails or does not appear in one or more courses of any end semester examinations up to Sixth Semester (Eight Semester under FYUG Course) shall be provisionally promoted to the next higher semester with the failed course as carry over course(s). Such candidates will be eligible to appear in the carry over course in the next regular examinations of those courses. However, the following restrictions shall be applicable:
  - (i) A candidate shall be entitled to a maximum of Four chances to clear a course.
  - (ii) If a candidate clears the last semester examination before clearing all the courses of the previous semesters, the result of the last semester examination of that candidate shall be withheld and his/ her results shall be announced only after he/ she clears the courses of the previous semesters.
- e) A student must pass all his/her semester examinations within five (5) years from the date of admission to the First Semester of any programme.
- f) Since the Semester system involves continuous assessment, there shall be no scope for a student to appear as a private candidate in any programme in this system.
- g) A candidate shall be declared to have passed the six semester Degree B.A./B.Sc programme provided he/ she has passed all the semesters and in all the Courses separately.

# PhD Programme

Currently, the PhD programme is offered by the following departments: **Assamese, Botany, English, Economics, Education, Political Science and Zoology.**

The Degree of Doctor of Philosophy (Ph.D.) shall be awarded to an eligible candidate by the college after successful completion of a course of study and research as prescribed under the regulation herein below.

### Eligibility:

A candidate for admission of the course leading to the Degree of Doctor of Philosophy (Ph.D.) must have passed the M.A./M.Sc. examination of Dibrugarh University/North Lakhimpur College (Autonomous) for this college or any other University/Institute recognized as equivalent by Dibrugarh University/North Lakhimpur College (Autonomous) or this college securing a minimum of 55% marks in the subject in which he/she intends to pursue the course. Under special circumstances a candidate may be allowed by the Research Council on the recommendation of the Department Research Committee to pursue the course in a subject other than one in which he/she obtained Masters' Degree, provided that the Research Council is satisfied that the branches are interrelated, and the candidate is competent to undertake the course in the subject.

### Admission Requirements:

All applicants seeking admission to the Doctor of Philosophy (Ph.D.) programme of the university must

have cleared the NET/SLET/ICAR/ICSSH/GATE tests or equivalents thereof as recognized by the college at the time of application. All other applicants must have cleared the North Lakhimpur College Research Admission Test (NLCRAT) (Please see Annexure-I). Relaxation up to 5% marks may be availed by the candidates belonging to the reserved categories.

### Admission Procedures:

The eligible candidates shall have to apply for admission to the Chairperson, Departmental Research Committee at the Department in which he/she desires to pursue research. The college shall advertise for admission through newspaper/college websites at least twenty (20) days ahead from the date of admission.

- For selection of candidates a weight age of 70% from NLCRAT score and 30% from the Viva-voce/Interview shall be given.
- The application for admission must be made in the prescribed form obtainable from the office of the principal on payment of prescribed fees.
- The Chairperson, DRC shall place the applications in the meeting of the Departmental Research Committee. The Departmental Research Committee shall conduct an interview of applicants and finalize the list of the eligible applicants for admission in the department.
- The Departmental Research Committee concerned shall allocate supervisors to each scholar at the time of admission.

# Hostel facilities and Hostel Rules

The college has two Girls' and two Boys' hostel. Seats are allotted at the time of admission on the basis merit. The students seeking hostel accommodation have to fill up a separate hostel admission form, which shall have to be submitted to the Principal within allotted time. The number of seats in the girls' hostel is 178 and the number of seats in boys' hostel is 140. The admission and the staying in the hostel is governed by the North Lakhimpur College hostel rules mentioned below:

## Procedure For Redressal of Grievances By Ombudspersons And Students Grievance Redressal Cell:

- The institute will open an online portal where any aggrieved student may submit an application seeking redressal of grievance.
- On receipt of an online complaint, the institution shall refer the complaint to the Students' Grievance Redressal Committee, along with its comments within 15 days of receipt of complaint on the online portal.
- The Students' Grievance Redressal Committee, as the case may be, shall fix a date for hearing the complaint which shall be communicated to the institution and the aggrieved student.
- An aggrieved student may appear either in person or authorize a representative to present the case.
- Grievances not resolved by the Students' Grievance Redressal Committee within the time period provided in these regulations may be referred to the Ombudsperson by the university.
- Institutions shall extend co-operation to the Ombudsperson or the Student Grievance Redressal Committee(s) in early redressal of grievances.
- The Ombudsperson shall, after giving reasonable opportunities of being heard to the parties concerned, on the conclusion of proceedings, pass such order, with reasons thereof, as may be deemed fit to redress the grievance and provide such relief as may be appropriate to the aggrieved student.
- The institution, as well as the aggrieved student, shall be provided with copies of the order under the signature of the Ombudsperson.
- The institution shall comply with the recommendations of the Ombudsperson.
- The Ombudsperson may recommend appropriate action against the complainant, where a complaint is found to be false or frivolous.
