## **PRELUDE**

North Lakhimpur College, established in 1952, has successfully carved its niche in the arena of higher education in Assam. Committed to raising standards of higher education, the college intends to equip the learners with sound theoretical knowledge, adequate practical exposure and develop in them the capacity to think. The founders aspired to enhance socio-cultural development of various ethnic groups, create scientific temperament, enhance employability of students and promote gender equality. Immensely concerned about the welfare as well as the intellectual and ethical development of the students, the institution provides value education, coaching and remedial classes besides establishing forums for community development and extension activities, establishing Equal Opportunity Centre, Women's Studies Centre etc. The College is committed to raising standards of higher education in this part of North Eastern India and for us, offering high quality teaching is more than just a priority- it is our *raison d'être*. The University Grants Commission has also conferred the status of College with Potential for Excellence (CPE) to this College in 2010. The College runs according to the Assam Provincialised College Management Act and Dibrugarh University Rules. At present the College offers graduate level courses in Arts and Science in nineteen (19) subjects besides the self-financed B.C.A course. Thrust has been given to relevant knowledge, skills, value addition and value based education leading to overall personality. New inter-disciplinary academic programmes namely P.G. Diploma in Disaster Management (under UGC's Innovative Scheme) and Post B.Sc. Diploma in Plant Tissue Culture and Micropropagation (DBT's Biotechnology popularization Scheme) have been started from the session 2009-10. Certificate and short term modular programmes are offered as value addition. The college has a main campus with a total area of 25 acres of land with compound wall all around and good infrastructure facilities for academic, administrative and co-curricular activities which include, adequate number of class rooms, well-equipped laboratories, library and reading room, administrative block, botanical garden, playground, gymnasium hall and parking facilities. The college library and computer facilities are easily accessible to students and faculty members. The college library has adequate space with limited reading room facility for students and faculty, issue counter, stack room and bound volume room. The Computer Center has two laboratories. One has 34 computers with an IBM server (land) and the other has 7 computers and an IBM server. Another state of the art Computer Networking Center with 8 computers was established in 2009. The college believes in all round development of the students and therefore considerable emphasis is laid upon extra curricular activities and the results are obvious-the college has a name among the colleges of Dibrugarh University as being academically excellent and a force to reckon in sports and cultural activities. The college has good indoor and outdoor sports facilities, training and participation record at all zonal and inter college competitions. The authority is leaving no stone unturned to guarantee that the College improve the existing infrastructure so that it can keep pace with the global trends whether it be in the field of research work or to enhance the quality of the teaching-learning process. Congenial academic atmosphere in a pollution free campus, introduction of innovative, self financing and industrial courses, ICT enabled teaching - learning practices, adequate infrastructure, library and other resources, good hostel facilities for both boys' and girls, good teachers' quality, transparent admission and enforcement of reservations, good results and progression are some of the key factors that attract students and stakeholders to North Lakhimpur College. ## **PART A**

### **The plan of action chalked out by the IQAC in the beginning of the year towards quality enhancement and the outcome achieved by the end of the year:**

#### **Plan of action chalked out by the IQAC:**

After the first NAAC assessment, wherein the College was accredited at B+ level, IQAC was established in the College by following norms and guidelines of NAAC. It consisted of representatives from all parts of the academia. Its main objective is to plan and execute quality initiatives and evaluate.

The plan of action chalked out by IQAC for the session 2010-11 is as follows:

- Proper implementation of CPE Plans and Programmes
- Networking of the campus with internet browsing terminals.
- Upgradation of all the existing teaching departments and library by incorporating new technologies and instruments.
- Seminars, workshops and awareness programme on various important issues.
- Liaison with NGO, different organizations and participation of masses for community development and disaster management through the College.
- Publication of college bulletin
- To add new infrastructure keeping in view of the increase enrollment.

#### **Major Outcome of IQAC Activities**

The IQAC has established several cells and centers and constituted committees to initiate activities -both academic and governance.

Under the CPE grant received from UGC, various projects have been initiated for the benefit of the learners and even the society as a whole by the college. The thrust area identified in consonance with the CPE guidelines is to affect a paradigm shift in the knowledge delivery system. Steps have already been taken to provide maximum use of all the ICT facilities in the college. The College has provided computers to all the departments. Twenty new desktop and four laptops are purchased other than the 70 already installed. Eighteen new LCD projectors are installed in the College. Three high tech Digital Interactive Board is installed at the Department of Computer Science, Physics and in conference room. Public Address Systems are installed at the big class rooms. Public Address Power Podiums are also installed.

LAN links with broadband internet facility is completed in the Administrative block, Old Block, Chemistry building, Zoology building, Physics & Electronics building. Steps have taken to provide ICT and audio-video facilities in general class rooms. Intercom facility is provided with 30 connections. A Bio-metric Time Attendance Machine is also installed. New college specific examination software has been installed for speeding up examination related works. The College website is redesigned. The Net and ICT facilities acquired under CPE scheme enhances and

enriches the teaching learning process. Local Area Network (LAN) using SOUL software has been installed for automating in-house activities and services of the library. A Digital High Speed Copier, Photo Scanner professional, Barcode Unit, Desktop Visual Book Presenter, Touch Screen Computer System, MSSQL Database, Software, new Laser Printers are added as part of CPE Scheme for use of all the stakeholders of the college. New books are also added. Generators are installed for uninterrupted power supply in the campus. New water filters have been put into place for the benefit of learners.

All the laboratories of Science departments are modernized with safety equipments and high quality working tables. A fume hood is installed in the Department of Chemistry. All old black boards are replaced with modern green and white boards. Each department is supplied with new notice board for displaying student related information. New display sign boards indicating location of each department are installed. As part of CPE scheme a Centre for Social Science Research and a state of the art Water Quality Surveillance Centre have been established to initiate in house research programmes. The Centre for Social Science Research has already taken steps to publish an e-journal entitled "Social Science Researcher" with Prof. Niru Hazarika as Chief Editor and Prof. Panigrahi as Assistant Editor. The 1<sup>st</sup> issue will be released by September, 2011. It is available at [www.ssrnlc.in](http://www.ssrnlc.in).

Outreach programmes and extension activities are also intensified with programmes like mother tongue awareness and value education in schools located in remote parts of the district. The college has developed liaison with various NGOs like Aaranyak, The Assam Science Society and Science Writers Association in organizing some outreach programmes. In this connection, the college has organised a one-day community consultation programme in collaboration with Aaranyak on flood hazards mitigation and governance on 15<sup>th</sup> May, 2011, which definitely helps in rendering valuable services during the time of crisis. The workshop was graced by noted environmentalist Dr. Parth Jyoti Das. "A National level Workshop on "Green Chemistry For Betterment of Environment" was organized by the Department of Chemistry in collaboration with the Assam Science Society, Lakhimpur Branch sponsored by UGC on 9<sup>th</sup> & 10<sup>th</sup> May 2011. UGC Sponsored National Seminar on Human Right and Duties was held on 19<sup>th</sup> and 20<sup>th</sup> June, 2010. Gandhian Study Centre organized UGC Sponsored National Workshop on Gandhian Thought and its Contemporary Relevance on 20<sup>th</sup> December, 2010. Department of Chemistry also organized "Celebration of the International Year of Chemistry" sponsored by UGC and also an exhibition for secondary and senior secondary students of the local schools on the theme "Chemistry for life".

The College has also published its Annual Bulletin for informing all stakeholders about its progresses. Financial assistance has also received from UGC to construct an Indoor Stadium and a new Women Hostel. Construction of basket ball court has just finished and the construction of new conference room and canteen are on verge of completion. During the session 2010-11, IQAC has been able to channelize the efforts and measures of the college towards academic excellence.

## Part B

### Criterion wise inputs for the year 2010-2011

#### 1. Activities reflecting the goals and objectives of the institution:

Over the course of the last six decades, North Lakhimpur College has been able to establish its reputation as the best institute of higher education in a region of at least ten lakh people inhabiting across the north-eastern part of the state of Assam. Since its inception, the college has been able to produce generations after generations of human resource with clarity of vision and astute moral purposiveness. These educated people have been engaged in different fields of activity around the country fostering national unity and harmony to usher in a fertile atmosphere conducive to socio-economic growth. Because of their enormous contribution to national development, the institution is proud to have these exceptional minds germinated right in its own backyard. Very appropriately, the college has been awarded with a respectable recognition of College with Potential for Excellence (CPE) by the University Grants Commission. The college is very positive about enhancing its contribution to the academic field to keep the flag of excellence flying high atop. The college authority shows zero tolerance towards any activities related with ragging. The college has a monitoring body headed by the Principal to keep surveillance of any untoward incident reported to have taken place inside the campus. Using of mobile phones inside the college campus is strictly prohibited.

- Value based education through various activities such as familiarizing life and work of Mahatma Gandhi, yoga and meditation sessions and observance of national days and anniversaries.
- Publication of college magazines, bulletin and departmental wall magazines to encourage the creative writing skills of the students.
- Award for advanced learners, free admission for economically backward students.

- The Committee system for functioning of the efficient administration and management.
- Encouraging and financing interested and able students to participate in inter, intra-college/university and regional/national programmes.
- Feedback from Students, faculty and employers.
- Establishment of water quality surveillance centre to initiate research in water chemistry.
- Intercom facility in each department and sector.
- Introduction of Biometric Time Attendance system to record the attendance of the staff.
- Setting up of Centre for Social Science Research.
- Enhancement of student services.

01. New academic programmes initiated:

There is very little scope for an affiliating college to develop new programmes as the academic authority rests in the hand of the affiliating University. Thus, within its capacity, the college undertakes environmental survey for the need of new courses, subjects, combinations based on current trends, market and societal needs and student's expectations. During 2010-11, the following academic programmes are initiated:

- “Analytical and Computational Chemistry” under the UGC’s COP scheme. UGC has already approved the course and the same will be started from the next session.
- Permission obtained to open PGDCA course under Dibrugarh University.
- New Certificate course in Gandhian Thought has been introduced from 2010 as enrichment course.
- A proposal has been sent to DBT, GoI to establish a “Bio-tech Hub” in the college.

02. Innovation in curricular design and Transaction:

The College has started Home Science as a core subject in degree programme from the session 2010-2011.

As the college is affiliated to Dibrugarh University, the frequency and the basis for syllabus revision is carried out by the Board of Studies of the said university. The college set up its own syllabus only for the certificate courses and the short term job oriented courses. From the academic session 2011-2012, Dibrugarh University is going to introduce semester system in undergraduate courses in its affiliated colleges in a major shift in curricular design.



03. Interdisciplinary programmes started:

- The College is going to start “Analytical and computational Chemistry” under the UGC’s COP scheme.
- New Certificate course in Gandhian Thought has been introduced in 2010 as enrichment course.

05. Examination reforms implemented:

The schedules of examinations in the college are conducted in a planned manner guided by the Academic Calendar. Students are assessed by intra-institutional evaluation methods of the institution, which can be outlined by taking into account the six major test apparatus namely Unit Tests, Sessional Tests, Terminal Examinations, Students Seminars, Essay Competitions, and Home assignments. The institution is very strict about the monitoring of the academic performance and co-curricular activities undertaken by the students. The main basis of the progress report intimated to the parents being the tests and examinations held from time to time ahead of the actual final examinations, the institution has been banking on four major ways to involve the students and their parents in the process: Answer-script, Mark-sheet, Guardian call, and Guardian meeting.

06. Candidates qualified for NET/SLET/GATE etc.

As an under graduate college, no regular students can appear in the NET/SLET examination. However, a good number of former students of the college have cleared such examinations.

07. Initiative towards faculty development programme:

The College has provision of granting study leave to interested teachers to pursue research works leading to Ph.D or M.Phil. by adjusting their teaching schedule without hampering the normal academic atmosphere of the college under FDP scheme of UGC’s five year plan.. 21. Improvement in the Library service

The CPE scheme gave impetus to the automation and computerization process of the Library. The process of covering the entire library collection through bar coding and associated automation has been accelerated and will be completed by the end of 2011. New computers are added to the Library under LAN with Internet browsing terminals. Local Area Network (LAN) using SOUL software has been installed for automating in-house activities and services of the library. A Digital High Speed Copier, Photo Scanner professional, Barcode Unit, Desktop Visual Book Presenter, Touch Screen Computer System, MSSQL Database, Software, new Laser Printers are added for use of all the stakeholders of the college. The enrichment of the library and the growing intervals of faculty and students generated a lot of academic activities which in turn resulted in the purchase of foreign books and subscription to Journals. More than 650 text / reference book several journals have been added to the library collection during this session.

### 23. Courses in which student assessment of teachers is introduced and action taken on student feedback:

The college has always taken the feedback from its students seriously. Their opinions are considered for discussion in meetings and if found feasible, implemented. The heads of the different departments are entrusted with the task of assessing the students' progress and their response to the faculty and the subject in question. The heads and the faculty personally ask them their opinion on the course and the way it is being delivered to them. On the basis of the students' feedback, the HoDs take corrective measures which are under their domain and for the rest send its report along with a number of suggestions that the departments deem required to be immediately attended to. In the middle of the academic session IQAC makes arrangement for students' feedback through a set of specially designed proforma and their analysis. The report of the feedback analysis is sent to the Principal with suggestions for continuous quality improvement. Students' feedback is sought in the TDC 1<sup>st</sup> year, 2<sup>nd</sup> yr, and 3<sup>rd</sup> yr. Arts, Science and Diploma Courses. Secrecy is maintained at the time of feedback. The college authority responded to the feedback of the students and the following measures have been taken up to fulfill their requirements.

- Introduction of new career oriented courses in Analytical and Computational Chemistry.
- Water purifiers were installed for drinking water in most of the departments of the college.
- Appointment of contractual faculty to taught specific subject area.
- Invitation of Guest faculty to deliver popular talk.
- Organization of Career Guidance Seminar.
- Introduction of remedial/tutorial/coaching classes.
- New books were added to the library to fulfill specific needs of the students.
- Use of Audio-visual aids in class room teaching.

Now the ICT enabled office facilitates the creation, handling, delivering and storage of information in digital forms and impacts every aspect of the workplace for both management and employee.

Through the academic and financial contributions, the alumni associations organise seminars and popular talks during the last session, which provide a forum for exchange of ideas of the alumni, the faculty and the present students. They are



also involved in development works of the College by offering funds. It also helps to develop a database of all the alumni with information about their employment, their employers and nature of their present work, contact addresses, phone numbers and e-mail IDs. Such information helps the present students to contact the alumni for suitable placement. Some of the alumni have contributed generously for various academic events on the campus.

### 31. Activities and Supports from the parents- teachers association:

The Guardian/Parent association contribute generously to the development of the college. An annual Guardian/Parent Meeting is held by the institution at least once in a year. The guardian/parents of the students are invited to the meeting and they are informed of the over-all picture of the academic progress made by the institution during the academic session. These meetings wholeheartedly support a constructive criticism offered by the parents/guardians that has the potential to make the institution more viable to meet the academic challenges of modern times. The association has been very active in dealing with matters related to the academic well being of the college family. At present the association has about 500 members with Mr. Sarat Ch. Chelleng as President and Mr Golap Hazarika as Secretary.

#### **Additional Information:**

During the last few years, the College has been trying to involve its alumnus, NGO's, GO's and other agencies for the development of the area and as such outreach programmes and extension activities are intensified for developing a well knit college-neighbourhood network. The area, where the College is located, is a flood prone area and is subjected to floods every year. There is need for holding workshops, showing films focusing on environmental hazards and programmes through mass media to educate public on environmental hazards. So, a strong platform is required to focus on different aspects of disaster management practices in the area and the college has developed liaison with various NGOs like Aaranyak, The Assam Science Society and Science Writers Association in organizing some outreach programmes. In this connection, the college has organised a one-day community consultation programme in collaboration with Aaranyak on flood hazards mitigation and governance on 15<sup>th</sup> May, 2011, which definitely helps in rendering valuable services during the time of crisis. The workshop was graced by noted environmentalist Dr. Parth Jyoti Das.

Over the years North Lakhimpur College has been able to collaborate with some of the institution of national repute for all round academic development of its students. The students pursuing the DBT sponsored Post B.Sc. Diploma Course in Tissue Culture and Micro propagation were also trained in NIST (CSIR), Jorhat.
