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North Lakhimpur College (Autonomous), established in 1952, has successfully carved its niche in the arena of higher education in Assam. Committed to raising standards of higher education, the college intends to equip the learners with sound theoretical knowledge, adequate practical exposure and develop in them the capacity to think. Probably it is the recognition of such efforts that the college was awarded the prestigious 'A' grade by the National Assessment and Accreditation Council (NAAC). The founders aspired to enhance socio-cultural development of various ethnic groups, create scientific temperament, enhance employability of students and promote gender equality. Immensely concerned about the welfare as well as the intellectual and ethical development of the students, the institution provides value education, coaching and remedial classes besides establishing forums for community development and extension activities, establishing Equal Opportunity Centre, Women's Studies Centre etc. The college is committed to raising standards of higher education in this part of North Eastern India and for us, offering high quality teaching is more than

just a priority- it is our raison d'être. The University Grants Commission was also conferred the status of College with Potential for Excellence (CPE) to the college in 2010 for a period of 5 years, further extended up to 2019. We are also the first autonomous college of the state. At present the College offers graduate level courses in Arts and Science in twenty (20) subjects besides the self-financed B.P.Ed, P.G.D.D.M, B.P.E.S and P.G.D.C.A., programmes. Based on the need, new courses at UG level have been introduced. The college has started PG programmes in Assamese, Electronics & Communication Technology, Political Science, Chemistry, Mass Communication and Physical Education from 2014 and 2015. The college has also started two courses on Sericulture, Office Automation, e-governance under UGC Community College Scheme from this session and B.Voc. courses in traditional aperl designing and marketing and mobile technology and cluod computing. Certificate and short term modular programmes are offered as value addition. Thrust has been given to relevant knowledge, skills, value addition and value based education leading to overall personality. There is

very little scope for an affiliating college to develop new programmes as the academic authority rests in the hand of the affiliating University. Despite this, North Lakhimpur College undertakes environmental survey for the need of new courses, subjects, combinations based on current trends, market and societal needs and student's expectations. Introduction of new inter-disciplinary academic programmes namely P.G. Diploma in Disaster Management (under UGC's Innovative Scheme) is the result of such efforts. It provide Certificate and Diploma course in Herbal (Medicinal) Plantation Information Technology, Repair and Maintenance of Consumer Electric Equipments, Human Rights and Gandhian Studies, Disaster Management. Certificate courses in Tourism & Travel and Analytical & Computational Chemistry are to commence from the 2012 -2013 academic session. Another event to cheer is the newly constructed Biotech Hub (Sponsored by Department of Biotechnology, Ministry of Science & Technology, Government of India) which promises to enhance research and provide training in Biotechnology. To ensure that the College maintains high standards of education in a student friendly manner, the authority takes feedback at regular intervals from the students and utilizes the data constructively. Recently the college has gain position in 150-200 rank band of NIRF institution ranking. North Lakhimpur College has proved to have the strategy to percolate the positive outcome of the innovations in teaching with an interdisciplinary approach. The gradual reform has made the college holistically efficient and credible both at the academic and administrative level. The learning is made student-centered by participatory learning activities through laboratory work; computer aided learning programmes, audio visual aids, project and field works, training programmes and study tours. To further the usages of information technology among students, the college has established two state of art Computer and Networking Centres with 50 internet browsing terminals besides encouraging the use of ICT tools in the teaching learning process. The campus have wifi connectivity. A state of the art language laboratory is also there. The thrust area identified in consonance with the CPE guidelines is to affect a paradigm shift in the knowledge delivery system. We visualize, in the immediate future, a smooth transition to digital learning without sacrificing the strengths of the conventional class room. The college has a main campus with a total area of 25 acres of land with compound wall all around and good infrastructure facilities for academic, administrative and co curricular activities which include, adequate number of class rooms, well-equipped laboratories, library and reading room, administrative block, botanical garden, playground, gymnasium hall, canteen and parking facilities. The Arts Building is being extended to meet the demands of the students. The college library and computer facilities are easily accessible to students and

faculty members. The college library has adequate space with reading room facility for students and faculty, issue counter, stack room and bound volume room. Facilities like touch screen computer, visual book display presenter, photocopier, scanner etc are available in the library. A retail outlet selling student related materials and books is also functional. The college playground has been given a face lift and an indoor stadium is there in place for sportsmen. stadium is there in place for sportsmen. The college strongly believes that its primary stake holders are students. It also understands the geographic, socio-demographic, economic and educational background of the people of this region. The college intends to provide quality education to all keeping in view the intelligence and economic status of the students. Whereas special remedial classes are organized for the academically poor students, the economically vulnerable but meritorious students are provided free admission and other in-house scholarships. 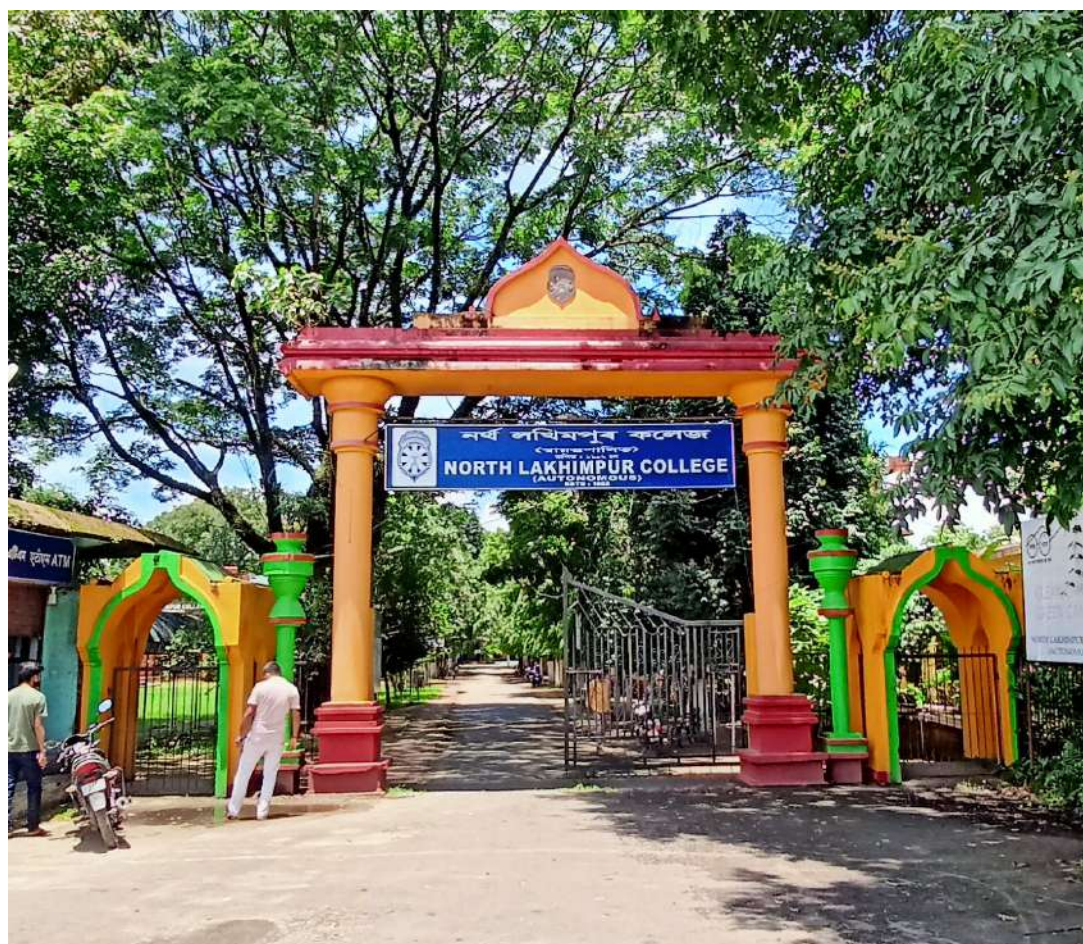

CBCS

As approved by the Governing Body as per suggestion of the 4th Academic Council Meeting held on 25th June, 2016 vide its Resolution No. 9, North Lakhimpur College (Autonomous) is going to introduce Choice Based Credit System (CBCS) in the Under Graduate Academic Programmes from the current session 2019-20.

Course Structure

The Course Structure of the Academic Programmes under the CBCS shall be as per the Course Structure given in Annexure I. The nature of the Courses for all Under Graduate Academic programmes shall be as below:

Core Courses

Compulsory components of an Academic Programme. These Courses are to be compulsorily studied as a core requirement for the programme. The contents of the Core Courses shall be as per the UGC guidelines.

Elective Courses

Elective courses shall be chosen by each student from a pool of courses. These courses may be intra-departmental, i.e. Discipline Specific Elective (DSE) as well as interdepartmental, i.e., Generic Elective (GE). The students shall have to choose minimum number of DSE and GE in every semester as prescribed in the Course Structure. These courses shall be:

- (i) supportive to the discipline of study
 - (ii) providing an expanded scope
 - (iii) enabling an exposure to some other discipline/ domain
 - (iv) nurturing student proficiency/ skill
- There shall be a basket of Elective Courses having equal number of credits. For the students of the same discipline/subjects these elective courses shall be intra-disciplinary and shall be called DSE Courses. If the students of other discipline/ subjects opt these electives shall be considered as inter-disciplinary and shall be called GE courses. The College may time to time fix relevant criteria for choosing the GE Courses.

Ability Enhancement Courses (AEC)

The Ability Enhancement Courses shall be of two kinds- "Ability Enhancement Compulsory Courses" and "Skill Enhancement Courses". These courses shall be interdisciplinary in nature. "AEC" Courses are the courses based upon the content that leads to Knowledge enhancement.

i. Ability Enhancement Compulsory Courses (AECC):

- (a) Environmental Science (4 Credit),
- (b) Communication English (2 Credit) and
- (c) Communication Hindi /MIL (2 Credit).

ii. Skill Enhancement Courses (SEC): (minimum 2 for honours courses and 4 for non-honours courses): These courses may be chosen from a pool of courses designed to provide valuebased and/or skill-based knowledge and should contain both theory and lab/hands-on/ training/fieldwork. The main purpose of these courses is to provide students life-skills in hands-on mode so as to increase their employability. The list provided under this category are suggestive in nature and the concerned Department has complete freedom to suggest their own papers under this category based on their expertise, specialization, requirements, scope and need.

The List of Skill Enhancement Courses (SEC) are given as Annexure II.

Grading System

- The absolute grading system shall be applied in evaluating performance of the students.
- The scale of grading system shall be governed by the North Lakhimpur College (Autonomous) Examination Ordinance.

M.Phil. Programme in Assamese

1. The Degree of Master of Philosophy (M.Phil) shall be awarded to an eligible candidate by the college after successful completion of a course of study and research as prescribed under the regulation herein below.
2. **Eligibility:**
A candidate for admission of the course leading to the Degree of Master of Philosophy (M. Phil) must have passed the M.A./M.Sc. examination of Dibrugarh University/North Lakhimpur College (Autonomous) or this college or any other University/Institute recognized as equivalent by Dibrugarh University/North Lakhimpur College (Autonomous) or this college securing a minimum of 55% marks in the subject in which he/she intends to pursue the course. Under special circumstances a candidate may be allowed by the Research Council on recommendation of the Department Research Committee to pursue the course in a subject other than one in which he/she obtained Masters' Degree, provided that the Research Council is satisfied that the branches are interrelated and the candidate is competent to undertake the course in the particular subject.
3. **Admission Requirements:**
All applicants seeking admission to the M.Phil programme of the university must have cleared the NET/SLET/ICAR/ICSSR/GATE tests or equivalents thereof as recognized by the college at the time of application. All other applicants must have cleared the North Lakhimpur College Research Admission Test (NLCRAT) (Please see **Annexure-I**). Relaxation upto 5% marks may be availed by the candidates belonging to the reserved categories.
4. **Admission Procedures:**
 - (i) The eligible candidates shall have to apply for admission to the Chairperson, Departmental Research Committee at the Department in which he/she desires to pursue research. The college shall advertise for admission through newspaper/college websites at least twenty (20) days ahead from the date of admission.
 - (ii) For selection of candidates a weight age of 70% from NLCRAT score and 30% from the Viva-voce/Interview shall be given.
 - (iii) The application for admission must be made in the prescribed form obtainable from the office of the Principal on payment of prescribed fees.
 - (iv) The Chairperson, DRC shall place the applications in the meeting of the Departmental Research Committee. The Departmental Research Committee shall conduct an interview of applicants and finalize the list of the eligible applicants for admission in the department.
 - (v) The Departmental Research Committee concerned shall allocate supervisors to each scholar at the time of admission.
5. **Admission Fee:**
Rs. 20,000.00 (one time, excluding examination fee)

Details about Free Admission (UG)

Who Can Apply

1. Students whose parental income is less than Rs. 1.00 Lakh from all sources will be eligible to avail this scheme.
2. If either of the parent (mother or father) of the student is working in the state Govt./Central Govt./Semi Govt./ State or Central Govt. Undertaking such students shall not be eligible under this scheme.

Proof of Income/Documents required:

1. An Income Certificate from the Local Revenue Circle Officer/Mauzadar
2. A declaration from the neither of the parent (father or mother) of the student is an employee of State/Central Govt. Department or its undertaking. Such form will be provided by College.

Power of Admission Committee:

The Admission Committee of the college will have to power to enquire into the income of the family in case of doubt in regard to students and if the committee is of the view that the income of the parents exceeds Rs. 2.00 Lakh, the committee may recommend cancellation .

Duties and Responsibilities of students availing the Scheme :

Students seeking admission into 1st year will plant a sapling at his/her College or at his/her home and shall give photograph of the same to the college. The Student has to nurse the sapling and while seeking admission into second year shall give photograph of the same tree that was planted during previous year' A Scrutiny Committee shall be constituted comprising teachers from Biology background who shall examine the photographs and will assess the genuineness of the Photographs and growth of the plant. Only on receipt of recommendation from the Committee, the student can avail 2nd year fee waiver. This will be effective from the session 2018 (applicable to those who benefitted under the scheme during 2017 session). Students availing the Second year fee waiver benefit during the Current Year will also plant a tree and will nourish it and submit photograph of the same while availing fee waiver benefit subsequently.

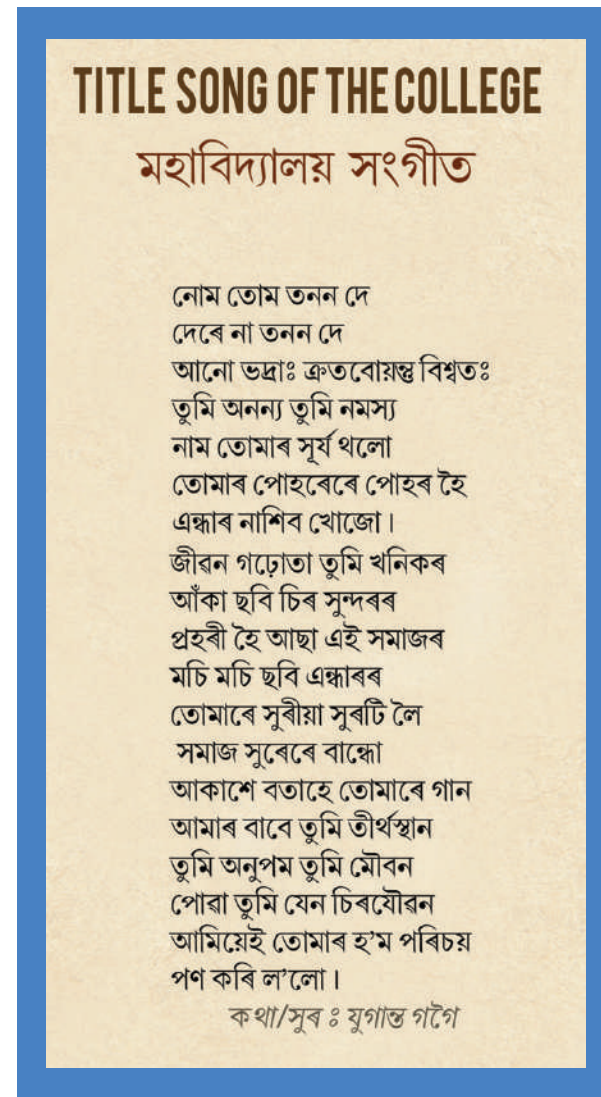

General Information & Guidelines

Requirements and Procedure for Admission

Application for admission to the college is to be made in the prescribed forms available along with the prospectus. College prospectus is issued immediately after the announcement of HSLC/HS results. One should carefully read the prospectus before filling up the forms. The admission forms can be detached from the prospectus and completely filled up form is to be submitted to the college office on the notified date. Admission to the college and hostels is strictly on merit and subject to approval of the Principal. There is reservation for SC, ST and OBC students as per Government of Assam regulations. There is sport and music quota for admission into various classes (the exact number of seats is determined by the admission committee). Students with outstanding quality in such fields may apply to the Principal directly in a plain sheet of paper with all supporting documents and certificates.

N.B.

- The NCTE regulations shall be applicable for admission into the B.P.Ed programme.
- The dates of interview for admission to various classes are notified in advance. A list of eligible candidates for

admission will be put up on the college notice board before the day of interview.

3. Students who are admitted on sports & music quota will have to show their performance as and when necessary failing which their admission will be cancelled. Interview and admission will take place on the same day.

The candidate will have to be present personally in the interview with the following documents and papers:

- Original / Provisional pass certificate from the head of the institution last attended.
- Certificate of date of birth.
- Mark-sheets (original).
- Gap period certificate from appropriate persons, if required
- Required amount of fees etc.

The selected candidates must get themselves admitted on the very day of interview. Failure to turn up will forfeit the claim for admission.

THE COLLEGE RESERVES THE RIGHT TO DENY ADMISSION TO ANY ONE WITHOUT GIVING ANY REASON

Results and progression of BA & BSc programme

- a) A candidate, shall be declared as passed a course, provided he/she secures-
- (i) at least 40% marks in each course in the end semester examinations.
 - (ii) at least 40% marks in each course in aggregate in the inand end-semester examinations.
- b) A candidate shall be declared as passed a semester, provided he/ she passes all the courses of a semester independently.
- c) The marks of in-semester examinations obtained by the candidate shall be carried over for declaring any result.
- d) A candidate who fails or does not appear in one or more courses of any end semester examinations up to Sixth Semester shall be provisionally promoted to the next higher semester with the failed course as carry over course(s). Such candidates will be eligible to appear in the carry over course in the next regular examinations of those courses. However, the following restrictions shall be applicable:
- (i) A candidate shall be entitled to a maximum of Four chances to clear a course.
 - (ii) If a candidate clears the sixth semester examination before clearing all the courses of the previous semesters, the result of the sixth semester examination of that candidate shall be withheld and his/ her results shall be announced only after he/ she clears the courses of the previous semesters.
- e) A student must pass all his/her semester examinations within five (5) years from the date of admission to the First Semester of any programme.
- f) Since the Semester system involves continuous assessment, there shall be no scope for a student to appear as a private candidate in any programme in this system.
- g) A candidate shall be declared to have passed the six semester Degree B.A./B.Sc programme provided he/ she has passed all the semesters and in all theCourses separately.

Attendance

A student who has less than 80% attendance shall not be permitted to sit for the End- semester examination in the couse in which the shortfall exists. Provided that it shall be open to the University to grant exemption to a student who has attended a minimum of 70% classes but failed to obtain the prescribed 80% attendance for valid reason on recommendation of the Head of the Department on payment of a prescribed fee(s). A student who has attended less then 70% classes will be punished.

Examination and Examination Rules

1. HS 1st year and final examinations will be held during the months of February and March by the College and AHSEC respectively. Examinations for the under graduate and post graduate classes are conducted by the college as per regulations passed by the Academic Council and Governing Body of the college.
2. Unit Test and Sessional examination will be held according to the college routine.
3. Periodic unit and class room tests in all subjects are held regularly. These are conducted by the respective departments independently.
4. Attendance in all these college examinations by the student is OBLIGATORY.

College Library and Library Rules

The College has a beautiful with well furnished reading room for both students and teachers separately. The reading room is also equipped with 5 compu ters with Internet Connectivity on Open Access basis which facilitates students to expose new horizon of knowledge. The number of books in the library at present is about 50,000. Moreover, the number of subscribed Journals by the Library is about 30.

Under Graduate and Post Graduate Examination & Evaluation procedure

- a) Examination and evaluation shall be done on a continuous and comprehensive basis during each semester.
- b) There shall be 25% marks for internal assessment in each course during every semester.
- c) Re-evaluation can be avail as per NLC examination ordinance.
- d) Internal Assessment:
 - i. In internal assessment, different tools may be employed one or more assessment tools such as objective tests, written tests, assignments, paper presentation, laboratory work, etc. suitable to the courses.
 - ii. The students shall be informed in advance about the nature of assessment. Students shall compulsorily attend internal assessment, failing which they will not be allowed to appear for the End-semester examination. A student cannot repeat Insemester examinations. The department may arrange special in semester examination whenever necessary.
- e) End Semester Examination:
 - i. There shall be one End semester examination carrying 75% Marks in each course of a Semester covering the entire syllabus prescribed for the course. Semester covering the entire syllabus prescribed for the course.
 - ii. The Controller of Examinations shall then make necessary arrangements for notifying the dates of the end semester examinations.
 - iii. Normally, the end –semester examination for each course shall be of three hour duration .
- f) Setting of question papers, moderation of question papers, evaluation of answer scripts, scrutiny, tabulation of marks, etc. and announcement of results, shall be North Lakhimpur College (Autonomous) Examination Ordinance, 2013.
- g) Practical Examination: Practical Examinations of a Semester shall normally be held prior to the End Semester Examinations.
- h) Betterment Examination:
 - i. A student shall be entitled to take the “betterment examinations” in any two theory courses of any of the six semesters after passing the sixth semester examination only once. In this case, the higher marks secured by the student shall be retained. The candidates shall have to apply for betterment examination within one year of passing the sixth semester examination.
 - ii. No betterment shall be allowed in the practical examinations.
 - iii. Any difficulty which may arise in the course of operation of these regulations relating to holding of examinations shall be removed by the Examination Committee of North Lakhimpur College (Autonomous).

Note: A student admitted into the M.A/M.Sc programmes shall have to clear at least 50% of the total course allotted in the first two semesters to be eligible for attending the 3rd Semester classes.

North Lakhimpur College Publication Committee has Granthalaya in collaboration with Assam Publishing House, for the benefit of the students. Books and student related stationary goods is available at subsidized rates. It remains open during college hours.

Hostel facilities and Hostel Rules

The college has two Girls' and two Boys' hostel. Seats are allotted at the time of admission on the basis merit. The students seeking hostel accommodation have to fill up a separate hostel admission form, which shall have to be submitted to the Principal within allotted time. The number of seats in the girls' hostel is 178 and the number of seats in boys' hostel is 140. The admission and the staying in the hostel is governed by the North Lakhimpur College hostel rules mentioned below:

1. The boarders must maintain decent, dignified disciplined hostel life inside and out side the hostel and obey the hostel rules.
2. They must abide by the rules and regulations of hostel as may be prescribed to them by the college authority, violation of which will lead to strict disciplinary action amounting to expulsion of the guilty inmates from the hostel leading to consequent expulsion from the college also.
3. All the boarders must abide by the mess-rules prescribed by the mess-committee of the hostel.
4. Boarders are not allowed to arrange any private messing within the hostel nor they are permitted to take meals outside the hostel.
5. Damage caused to hostel property by any boarder is dealt with severe punishment leading even to the expulsion from the hostel as well as from the college.

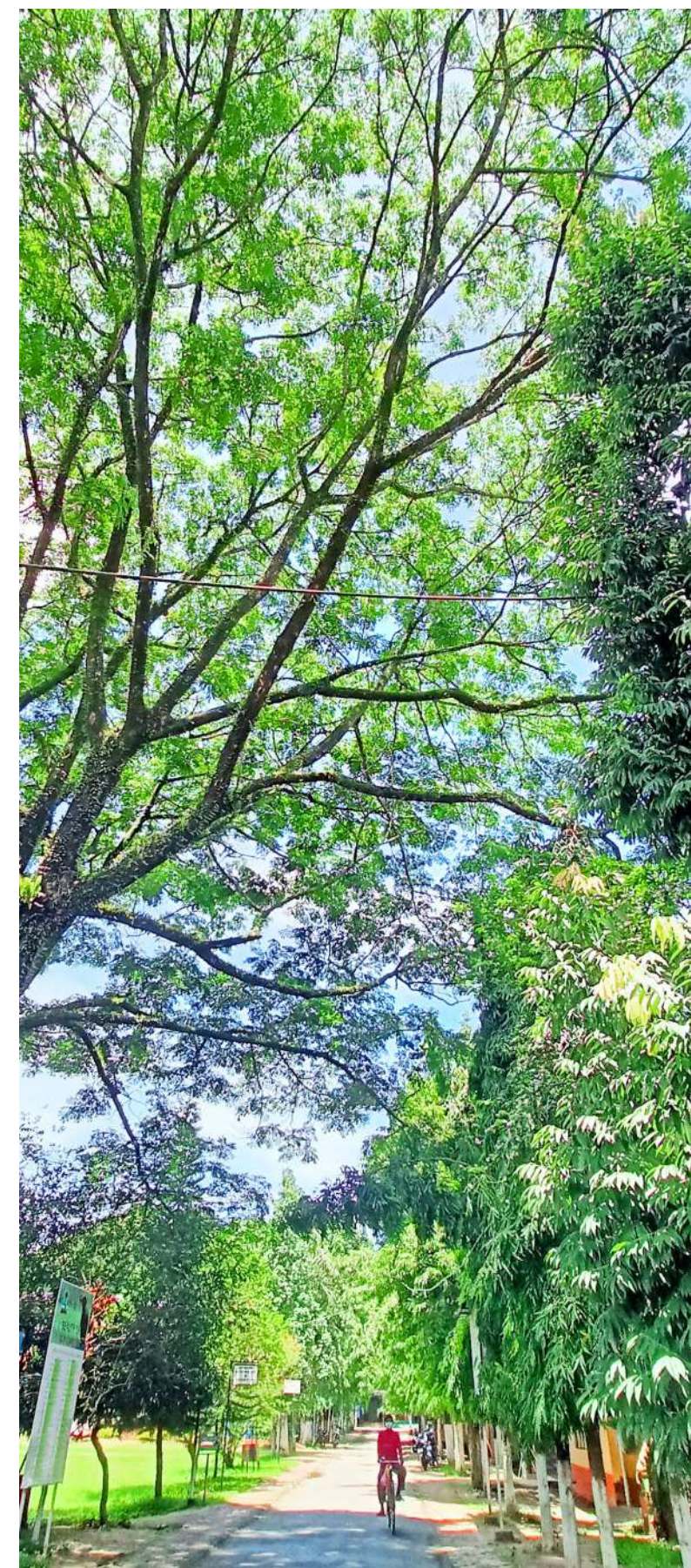

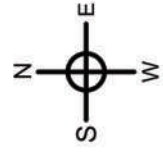
